

Out-of-School Youth Programs

Description: The Out of School Youth program provides services to individuals ages 19 – 21 who are low income, high school dropouts or have received a high school diploma but are basic skills deficient, unemployed or under-employed. Programs for out of school youth focus on training activities that lead to careers.

- Services:
- ◆ Improving educational achievements which includes such elements as tutoring, study skills training, secondary school completion; drop out prevention and alternative secondary school offerings
 - ◆ Preparing for and succeeding in employment including paid and unpaid work experience; internships; job shadowing opportunities and occupational skills training
 - ◆ Support service including mentoring and comprehensive guidance and counseling
 - ◆ Services intended to develop the potential of youth as citizens and leaders
 - ◆ Emphasis on work readiness skills which includes career planning and decision making, labor market information and effective problem solving skills
